Family Finds Resilience and Healing, Thanks to You

Summer should be a carefree time when families can relax. But for Aria's family, the break from routine led to a season of hardship and pain.

In August 2021, 7-year-old Aria and her two siblings were bored and snuck upstairs to play. There, they found alcohol and matches that had accidentally been left within their reach.

Their mom, Ana, had left the kids alone for just a minute. Ana only became aware of their actions when she heard a loud explosion and the screams of the children.

She saw Aria engulfed in flames at the top of the stairs. Thinking quickly, Ana tried to remove her daughter's burning clothing, then smothered the flames with a shower curtain.

Because of your generosity, Aria's family received the financial and emotional support they needed. That included help with paying for rent, utilities, and meals while Aria was in the hospital. Later, you helped refer the family to counseling and brought them comfort by connecting them to other survivors and their families.

"We are forever grateful for all the help that Arizona Burn Foundation provided for our family," says Ana.

The months that followed the accident took a heavy toll on the family. But Aria's strength — and your compassion — inspired them to keep moving forward.




